Response: Yes, I believe it is important to have performance/results indicators. Publishing statistics would also be an effective tool to alert the community about potential problems with animal control I would use it as a public education tool to measure the effectiveness of the program.

10. With so many community cats roaming in neighborhoods, do you believe and support Trap-Neuter-Return (TNR) to be the only humane solution to control population of outdoor cats in City of Fulshear? Would you support any laws or policy changes necessary to allow appropriate provisions and to provide funding to implement TNR in City of Fulshear?

Response: Yes, I prefer the TNR over the alternative euthanization.
